

ACPF-CPPAP Online Webinar for Japanese Businesses in the Philippines

Short Description:

This is a 2nd Crime Prevention Seminar jointly organized by the Crime Prevention Practitioners Association of the Philippines (CPPAP) and the Asia Crime Prevention Foundation or ACPF, in cooperation with the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM) and the Japanese Chamber of Commerce and Industry of the Philippines, Incorporated (JCCIFI). Because of the pandemic, the seminar will be conducted online and shall be through the Zoom Webinar platform.

The Webinar is part of the activities calendared to commemorate **National Crime Prevention Week (NCPW)** in the Philippines which is observed from September 1 to 7 of every year. The event aims to help current and prospective Japanese business companies build confidence to maintain and pursue business and investment plans through heightened awareness in crime prevention, crime reporting and enhancing coordination with Philippine government authorities.
